

Program Participation Terms and Conditions

These Participation Terms and Conditions (hereinafter referred to as the “Terms”) set forth the matters to be observed when applying for and participating in the following program (hereinafter referred to as the “Program”), which is organized by **Sungkyunkwan University (SKKU)** (hereinafter referred to as the “Organizer”) and supported by **eiicon Co., Ltd.** (hereinafter referred to as “eiicon”).

By applying for the Program, you are deemed to have agreed to these Terms.

Please read these Terms carefully and fill out the required information before submitting your application via the application form. (The application form includes a link to the Terms of Use of “AUBA/AUBA Global,” operated by eiicon; however, if you are not an AUBA/AUBA Global member, those terms will not apply.)

1. Definitions

Terms used in these Terms are defined as follows:

1. **“Participant”** refers to a company or individual who meets the eligibility criteria, agrees to these Terms, applies for participation, and is approved by the Organizer.
2. **“Supporting organizations/companies”** refer to entities that review the feasibility of a Participant’s proposal and, if feasible, proceed with development toward commercialization. (The Organizer may also act as a supporting

organization/company.)

3. **“Organizer, etc.”** collectively refers to the Organizer, supporting organizations/companies, and collaborators.
4. **“Proposal”** refers to all materials submitted by the Participant (regardless of medium — including documents, sketches, diagrams, 3D data, CG data, photos, audio, video, software, and prototyped hardware, as well as presentation content). This includes both pre-submitted and same-day submissions.
5. **“Participant’s rights”** refer to all intellectual property rights (including copyrights under Articles 27 and 28 of the Copyright Act, patents, utility models, designs, know-how, etc.) owned by the Participant prior to participation in the Program.

2. Purpose of the Program

1. The Program aims to foster new product and business development and innovation by enabling the Organizer, etc., and Participants to co-create business ideas through the exchange of diverse perspectives, knowledge, and technologies.
2. After the application period, the Organizer, etc., will evaluate and select proposals based on submitted materials. The reasons for selection or rejection will not be disclosed, and individual inquiries regarding evaluation results will not be answered.

3. Intellectual Property Rights Contained in Proposals

Proposals will be shared with the Organizer, etc., for the purpose of evaluation and selection. Handling of intellectual property rights shall be as follows:

1. Rights contained in a Proposal remain with the Participant.
2. If a Proposal includes the Participant’s rights, the Participant shall grant sufficient permission to the Organizer, etc., to allow use and implementation.
3. If a Proposal includes intellectual property rights belonging to third parties, the Participant shall ensure necessary authorization to allow the Organizer, etc., to use or implement them.
4. Participants may not include third-party intellectual property or trade secrets without proper authorization.
5. Ownership of any new intellectual property created during the Program (including jointly developed IP) shall be discussed and agreed upon between the Organizer, etc., and the Participant.

6. Notwithstanding (1) above, Participants may not disclose Proposals containing materials, trademarks, or trade names provided by the Organizer, etc., or eiicon, to third parties (including online) without prior written approval.
7. Both the Organizer, etc., and Participants shall maintain the confidentiality of any business or technical information marked as confidential and shall not disclose it to third parties (including online) without prior consent.
8. Proposals must not contain content that defames others; promotes specific groups, religions, or ideologies; is obscene, illegal, antisocial, or offensive to public order and morals; or infringes upon others' rights.

4. Commercialization of Proposals

1. If a supporting organization/company expresses interest in commercialization, the Participant shall respond in good faith to requests such as licensing or disclosure of necessary information.
2. The Participant and the supporting organization/company shall enter into separate agreements concerning licensing, implementation, proof-of-concept testing, and development as necessary.
3. Even if eiicon provides consulting support to facilitate commercialization, eiicon shall not act as the implementing party for experiments or development.
4. Participation in the Program does not guarantee commercialization of any submitted proposal.

5. Public Relations and Promotion

The Organizer, etc., and eiicon may use summaries of Proposals and records of Program activities (including photos) for advertising, publicity, or research purposes on websites (including social media), flyers, or promotional materials.

If a Participant holds rights to the summary or photos used, and requests prior consultation, the Organizer, etc., shall discuss the publication details with the Participant.

6. Handling of Personal Information

Personal information submitted in the application will be collected and managed by the Organizer, supporting organizations/companies, and eiicon as follows:

7. Compliance with Rules and Instructions

Participants shall comply with all rules and instructions from the facility administrators, the Organizer, etc., and eiicon regarding the use of facilities, equipment, and tools used in the Program.

If a Participant intentionally or negligently damages such equipment, they may be required to cover the repair or replacement costs.

8. Liability

1. If a Participant suffers damages due to the willful misconduct or gross negligence of the Organizer, etc., or eiicon, the liable party shall compensate the Participant for direct and ordinary damages (excluding lost profits and legal fees). The Organizer, etc., and eiicon bear no other liability.
2. If a Participant causes damage to the Organizer, etc., or another Participant, they shall be responsible for compensating the damage. Any disputes with third parties arising from a Participant's violation of these Terms shall be resolved between the relevant parties, and the Organizer, etc., and eiicon shall bear no responsibility.

9. Exclusion of Anti-Social Forces

Participants represent and warrant that they are not, and will not in the future be, associated with organized crime groups, members thereof, or other anti-social forces, and that they will not provide funding or otherwise cooperate with or engage in any interaction with such entities.

10. Violation of Terms

If the Organizer determines that a Participant has violated these Terms, the Organizer may refuse or cancel the Participant's participation in the Program.

11. Program Suspension

The Organizer may suspend, interrupt, or modify (including content changes) the Program without prior notice to Participants if deemed unavoidable due to natural disasters or other operational reasons.

12. Good Faith Discussion

If any doubt arises regarding the interpretation of these Terms, the parties shall discuss and resolve the matter in good faith.
